

Ideas for Kids' Activities for 250th Anniversary Celebrations:

- Learning/Academic Activities
 - Writing thank you cards to local legislature/mayor/etc.
 - Engaging in mock vote
 - Playing game with matching amendment to right conferred (could also be made into a competition)
 - Recording station (or mini podcast station) where kids can record pledge of allegiance, recite constitution, etc.
 - Writing their own constitution on a really big poster (start with We the people at the top and kids can add to it)
 - Stamping which town they're from on a map of Vermont
- Crafts
 - Tie-dye kits (red, white, and blue t-shirts or people bring their own things to tie-dye)
 - Face paint
 - Crafts: decorate their own US flags, make flower stamps, paper bag puppets, eagle grommets using cut outs
- Physically Active Activities
 - Old-fashioned games (hoops, potato sack racing, spoon on egg races, marbles/jacks game, etc.)
